QUARTZITE CARE GUIDE

Quartzite is a durable natural stone known for its strength, beauty, and unique veining. Each slab has its own natural color, movement, and character.

DAILY CLEANING

Clean with warm water, mild dish soap, and a soft microfiber cloth. Dry with a clean towel to prevent water spots. Use pH-neutral stone cleaners when needed.

WHAT TO AVOID

Avoid vinegar, lemon juice, bleach, ammonia, oven cleaners, strong degreasers, abrasive powders, steel wool, rough sponges, and acidic products.

Do not cut directly on quartzite or place hot items directly on the surface.

SPILLS & SEALING

Clean spills quickly, especially wine, coffee, oil, tomato sauce, citrus juice, vinegar, and colored liquids. Blot with a clean cloth instead of spreading.

Quartzite should be sealed after installation and resealed as needed. To test the sealer, place water on the surface for 15 minutes. If the stone darkens, it may be time to reseal.

BEST PRACTICES

Use coasters, cutting boards, trivets, and soft cloths. Protect edges, corners, seams, and sink cutouts from impact.

1. DAILY CLEANING

Wipe the surface regularly with warm water, mild dish soap, and a soft microfiber cloth. After cleaning, dry thoroughly with a clean towel.

This helps maintain the surface's natural luster and prevents any residue buildup.



2. WHAT TO AVOID

Avoid acidic products (lemon, vinegar, citrus), abrasive cleaners, harsh chemicals, bleach, ammonia, glass cleaners, and strong degreasers.

These can dull the finish and damage quartzite over time.



3. SEALING & PROTECTION

Quartzite should be sealed after installation and resealed as needed. Sealing reduces absorption but does not make the surface stain-proof, heat-proof, scratch-proof, or acid-proof.

Use cutting boards, trivets, and coasters. Protect edges, corners, seams, and sink cutouts from impact.



4. BEFORE YOU CLEAN

Always ensure that any cleaning product is safe for quartzite or natural stone.
